## JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to limit the number of terms an individual may serve as a Member of Congress.

Whereas

Now, therefore, be it

1        *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
 2        *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*  
 3        *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-  
 4        lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-  
 5        stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all  
 6        intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when  
 7        ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

1 States within seven years after the date of its submission  
2 for ratification:

3 “ARTICLE —

4 “SECTION 1. No person shall serve as a Representa-  
5 tive for more than six two-year terms. Service as a Rep-  
6 resentative for more than one year of any two-year term  
7 shall be treated as a complete term for purposes of this  
8 section, without regard to whether the service was com-  
9 pleted by the individual originally elected to the term.

10 “SECTION 2. No person shall serve as a Senator for  
11 more than two six-year terms. Service as a Senator for  
12 more than three years of any six-year term shall be treated  
13 as a complete term for purposes of this section, without  
14 regard to whether the service was completed by the indi-  
15 vidual originally elected to the term.

16 “SECTION 3. This article shall not apply to any per-  
17 son who served as a Representative or as a Senator during  
18 any Congress occurring before the One Hundred Eight-  
19 eenth Congress.”.
